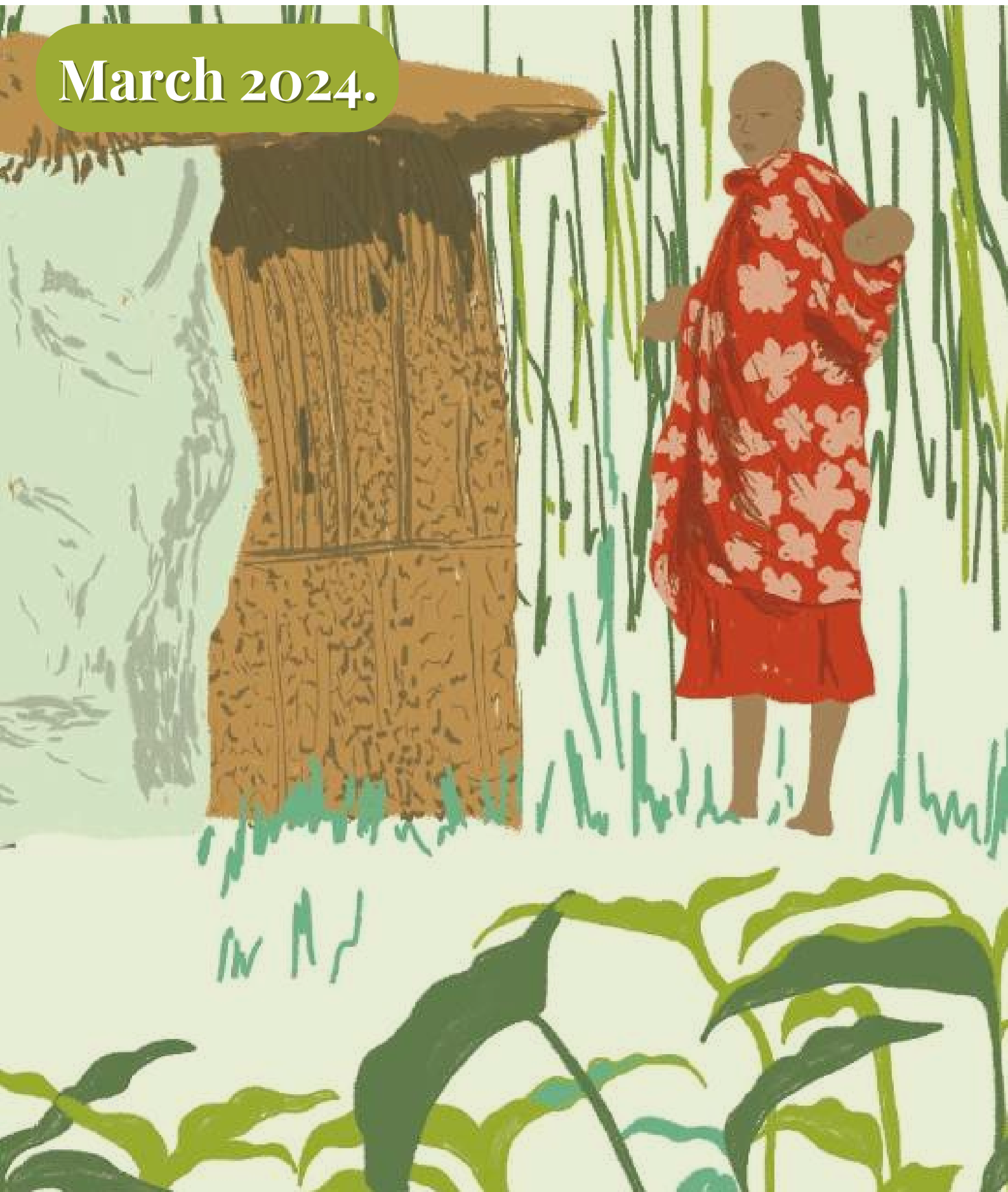

Name of the area

Nanga-Wasiko B., Kisumu, Kenya

Malaria is a significant public health problem in Kisumu.

70% More than 70% of the population is at constant risk from Malaria, including those most vulnerable to the disease, specifically children and pregnant women; in the past five years there has been a concerted effort by the government and Malaria partnership to fight the disease: through prevention and treatment intervention, such as mass and routine mosquito net distribution programs to attain universal, intermittent preventive treatment for Malaria during pregnancy.

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The Kisumu Malaria indicator surveys **one of the key performance monitoring tools** periodically used to provide a correct assessment of Malaria control efforts over time.

17% were adults between 25 and 27 years old

All presented fever



Malaria rapid test detected **83% positive**



Plasmodium falciparum

The malaria rapid test available in Nanga detects *P. falciparum* only.
