Malaria-free Africa



We delivered 5 new workshops

2 workshops for educators and teachers.
2 workshops for community health promoters.
1 workshop for parents at the school.



We regularly educate households during weekly home visits.

3 Practical environmental workshops.

Workshop 1 : Environment - 135 people attended
Workshop 2: Environment – 88 adolescents attended.
Workshop 3: Planting repellent plants in the Wigwa
area 60 people attended



Weekly visits by health promoters to households to educate, detect cases, facilitate access to diagnosis at health centres, and follow up on appropriate treatment and recovery.





We provided spirulina to children at Lake Victoria School to strengthen their immune systems.



We taught how to care for mosquito nets with practical demonstrations: washing, hanging, repairing tears, etc.



We covered holes in walls to prevent mosquitoes from entering homes.



We attended a training workshop on the use of the plant Artemisia annual for malaria prevention.



We cultivated seeds, harvested the repellent plants, distributed them and planted them in households.



We educated families about repellent plants.



We created monitoring forms to follow up on prevention measures and malaria cases in households and at the school.



We visited the Kisumu spirulina centre, delivered a malaria workshop to the centre's staff, and protected spirulina production from insects using nets.



We collaborated with the project "No School Without Chalk" by Cristina Bertrand to provide children at Lake Victoria School with chalk and textbooks for all grades and subjects.



We also collaborated with this project in the manufacture and distribution of beds and mattresses to families who were sleeping on the ground, over puddles and mosquito breeding sites.



We collaborated on another project to manufacture desks for Lake Victoria School.



We distributed mosquito nets.
